Pupil Premium Plan 2016 –2017

Rationale: To support all Pupil Premium pupils to access their learning and make expected or better progress.

Amount: £3,960 (Not including unplanned additional funding received). As numbers of Pupil Premium children are very low this year, a numerical target to measure progress or attainment is not statistically viable. Thorough tracking of impact is in place for each individual.

The review of our pupil premium strategy is regular, at least half-yearly.

Speech & Language	CC – 1 morning a week x 3 terms	<u>£2,250</u>	SENCo	CC assists staff with advice for classroom practice, which ensures her work is followed through on a daily basis for those pupils with S & L needs. She works with pupils in class as well as one to one. She assists SENCo with diagnostic assessments which ensure that the correct support is actioned. She writes reports to support IEP writing, EHCP applications.
Mathematics	Spring and Summer Term 2017	<u>£1,117</u>	Chichester University Maths Adviser	Develop staff understanding of mastery in maths, support pupils to develop strong number sense, which will positively impact on maths attainment and progress across the school.
School Start resources	Support younger pupils through regular sessions with trained adult	<u>£35</u>	SENCo/Early Years lead	Pupils will develop skills to support them with learning readiness. This will support them to access the curriculum.

Fine motor skills packs	Support pupils with developing fine motor skills to support mark making and handwriting.	<u>£100</u>	Early Years/English lead	Packs made up and sent home so that pupils can practise developing these skills at home with family member as well as in school.
