| Speech & Language | Speech and language therapist employed for 1 morning a week | £ 1,696 | SENCo | Assist staff with advice for classroom practice to improve understanding and cognition. Working with small groups and 1:1 to develop speech and language skills for children to access the curriculum and make good progress. |
